Later, the UMT team was also invited for a reception by the Chief Minister Punjab **Muhammad Shahbaz Sharif** and an evening with the Pakistani Cricket Team and tennis star **Aisam-ul-Haq**.

Dr Hasan Sohaib Murad, Rector UMT, met Rashid Hussain, Director, Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation (CENTIN) and the winning team at the UMT campus. He congratulated them on getting the second position at the competition. He was of the view such competitions should be organized more frequently to involve young people in innovative projects. **Dr A R Kausar**, Pro-Rector UMT, also congratulated the team on their success and shared his own experiences with them. Dr Kausar encouraged them to participate in international contests in order to move from the local to the international competitive markets.

Explaining the concept of the winning project, Rashid Hussain, Director CENTIN, said that the team came up with the final project with an incubation period of just 45 days. Mavra Naeem, Azhar Tahir Nabi, Mowahid Islam, Faizan Malik and Mobeen Ahmed worked tirelessly to refine and enhance the project. The end product is a device that can be used to control home appliances. Using GSM technology, users can send messages to the device that instructs the home appliance such as TV, refrigerator, air conditioner, lights, etc. that are attached with this device to comply with the directions that have been sent. For example, you can open your front door from anywhere in the world or tell your micro wave oven to start baking at a specified time so that you get what you want by effectively managing your time and money.

The basic concept of GSM Home is very simple. Once the device is attached to a machine, it processes the user's instructions and sends coded instructions to the machine. At present, 6 appliances can be attached to the device but the team is already working on enhancements. One of the factors that weighed in favor of GSM Home was the micro level potential of the project. Secondly, it addresses convenience and security issues of today's market in an effective manner.

Each member of the UMT team made his/her unique contribution to the project. Mavra managed different aspects of the project, coordinated with all team members and presented GSM Home to the panel of judges. Azhar conducted the main research and worked on various project features. Faizan conducted the consumer market survey. Mohawid worked at the project finances and came up with different market strategies. Sundas Nazir, Research Coordinator for CENTIN, kept the team together through tough times and served as the motivation for the entire team – a fact that is acknowledged by all team members.

The team already plans to take the project to the international level. They are seeking a patent for their product and working towards raising venture capital. A number of investors and businessmen shave already shown interest in the product. The LCCI Advisory Board has invited the team for a meeting. It is expected that research and funding would be provided for the project.

Rashid Hussain, Director CENTIN, and the faculty of the School of Business and Economics (SBE) deserve special commendation for dedicating their time and expertise to advise the students in completing the project.

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Delegation from the Sultanate of Oman visits UMT

The delegation was welcomed at the UMT campus by the Pro-Rector **Dr A R Kausar**, faculty and management staff. The delegation visited the facilities extended to the students by UMT. They visited the library that houses over 55000 books and offers online access to 14000 research journals. The delegation also toured the Information Processing Center that serves 2000 participants daily. They saw the science and engineering laboratories with modern computer network and latest equipments. The delegates expressed their full satisfaction over the wide range of facilities extended to the students, and appreciated the quality and standard of education being provided by UMT.

Later, a meeting was held in the Board Room. It was attended by the deans, registrar, faculty members, and heads of the departments. Dr A R Kausar, Pro-Rector UMT, briefed the delegation about UMT, its history, undergraduate and graduate programs recognized by the Higher Education Commission of Pakistan (HEC) and the Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC). He said that transparency and merit are the cornerstone of our scholarship and financial aid policy. He also highlighted that the continuity of scholarship and financial aid has been linked to academic performance and if the GPA of financial aid recipient goes below 2.5 in case of a bachelor student and less than 3.0 in case of a master student, the financial aid automatically stops. The delegation appreciated the support UMT is extending to the deserving and the needy. They shared with participants the initiatives taken and the investment made by the Oman government to promote education and the knowledge cause. The delegation expressed delight over what UMT has achieved so far in a span of two decades of its history, and promised to present and project the case of UMT and its projects to the Oman government and business community. Dr Hasan Sohaib Murad, Rector UMT, chaired the first meeting of the Quality Cell (QC) on March 31, 2011. **Dr A R Kausar**, Pro-Rector UMT and Head QC, **Dr Abdul Raouf**, SI, University Professor and Advisor, and faculty members of the University attended the meeting.

During the meeting, the strategic importance of maintaining quality for sustainable competitive growth was emphasized. There was a general consensus that efforts need to be unified to enhance quality. The Rector advised the attendees to keep themselves informed of quality measures and follow them to the fullest. It was agreed that the quality manual drafted by Dr Raouf, SI, University Professor and Advisor, would be followed at UMT and detailed processes and procedures would be developed for quality assurance. During the meeting, student feedback survey for Fall 2010 was shared with the attendees. A total of 12190 students from the School of Business and Economics (SBE), School of Science and Technology (SST), School of Social Sciences and Humanities (SSS&H), School of Professional Advancement (SPA), Institute of Audit and Accountancy (IAA), and Institute of Textiles and Industrial Sciences (ITIS) responded to questions related to course material, class teaching, class assessment and other resources. While the survey showed an overall satisfaction level of 82%, a number of recommendations were made regarding improvements in the 04 categories. It was also decided that a comprehensive report indicating the state of quality at UMT would be prepared in the light of feedback from all stakeholders.

US Embassy Consular Services briefed the students on F1 Visa applications and success strategies. Representatives of the United States Educational Foundation in Pakistan spoke to the students about upcoming scholar-ship/exchange opportunities as well as the various testing and educational advising services that are available to the Pakistani students. **Dr Mujahid Mansoori**, Head of the Department of Media and Communication, and **Ashar Ramish**, faculty member of the School of Business and Economics (SBE) asked questions from the panel on behalf of their students.

Talk hosted by IFC and CLP for lawyers and in-house counsels


A Montage of Literary Essays and Critical Articles by Dr Qabil Khan published
