

The hands-on learning in threat analysis and response formulation employing cutting edge frameworks and tools is a key feature of the course.

Participation Criteria

- Course is open to personnel of armed forces, para military forces, police, intelligence organizations from security and counter terrorism affairs or any other related area of work and/or civilian equivalents (police officers, academics, experts, policy makers).
- Media, civil society, university students and NGO executives having understanding of security issues can also join.
- 3. The participants should be proficient in English language.
- Apart from individuals, institutional applications will be accepted.
- If the application is confirmed, course director will inform the applicant about his/her attendance to the course.

Course Fee

- Course Fee: PKR 60,000 US \$ 585 (Students, media, NGOs and civil society can join at discounted rates)
- Fee covers cost of course material, meals, refreshments.
- The fee will be required to be deposited on first day of the course in cash or bank draft in favour of UMT, Lahore.

Important

- Participants will be responsible for all their expenses.
- Lecturers' expenses (flights, transportation, visa, accommodation, meals) will be covered by TRI-Pakistan. Extra expenses will be the responsibility of the lecturer.
- 3. For successful completion, participants should attend 3/4 of the course.
- 4. Dress code: Executive attire (Ladies accordingly).

Hotel Information

TRI-Pakistan has reached an understanding with Falettis Hotel to provide accommodation at discounted rates to course participants desirous of staying in the hotel. To avail this facility, participants should not approach the Hotel directly but through course director and his assistants.

Visa

Lecturers and foreign participants are responsible for obtaining the necessary documents to travel to Pakistan. TRI-Pakistan can provide support in the form of an invitation letter, but the decision of whether to grant a visa rests with the host country. Lecturers and participants must proceed by themselves to obtain their visas from embassies or consulates of Pakistan in their country of origin. Visa expenses of the lecturers will be covered by TRI-Pakistan, as long as they hand over their youchers after the arrival.

Medical Service

- There is no medical facility at TRI-Pakistan. In this regard, all illness or accidents will be referred to civilian medical facilities.
