MA TESOL

MA TESOL (Teaching of English to the Speakers of others Languages) is a two year degree programme, which is designed to cater the growing need of English language teachers in Pakistani context. The courses are planned according to the latest researches in the field of English language teaching and linguistics for the speakers of other languages to cope up with the emerging challenges of teaching. This two year research based degree programme equips the teachers to teach through multiple methods and strategies at several levels according to the needs of the students. The syllabus is composed on the practical and theoretical aspects of English language teaching, which includes; ELT methods of teaching and assessing four (reading, writing, speaking and listening) skills, pedagogical grammar, language and society, ELT classroom management and resource development, curriculum development and teaching practice, in major. These modules investigate the current issues prevailing with the learners and teachers in the field of English language teaching. The program places a strong emphasis on a distinctive blend of theory and practice that leads the students to an experimental and practical learning based on the modern research in second language acquisition.
