Course Introduction

Sigh language is a natural and visual form of the language that uses movements and expressions to convey meanings between/among people. It is known as a non-verbal language, which deaf persons exclusively count to connect with their social environment. It is based on visual cues through hands, eyes, face, mouth and body.

By keeping in view **SDG-4** "Quality Education" and **SDG 10** "Reduce Inequalities" this program will possess its uniqueness of coverage from school education to higher education and domestic to public places. According to the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics and national census 1998 (still considered authentic), community with hearing impairment is around 40% of the general disabled population. The aim to conduct this short course is to orientate and educate the community without disabilities around them, to understand the silent language of community with hearing impairment. The focused population for the training is, parents, siblings, professionals, teachers, UMT participants and general community members.

***Each unit of the course is itself very comprehensive in nature. This certificate course will definitely highlight a number of silent issues to initiate the planning for intervention. The depth of the course will be judged during its execution and future course/s will be planned according to the interest of the participants.

Importance of sign language

Studying PSL would promote and sensitize the community for addressing the social adjustment problems and creating the awareness for community building and rehabilitation. PSL will develop a strong appreciation for deaf culture and can project understanding acceptance of the language among others.
