Summary of revisions suggested in the roadmap

1. Reduction in the course work of PhD IR program:

Current course work credit hours in PhD IR at UMT are 27 credit hours. HEC requirement of Course work credit hours for PhD is 18 credit hours. It is proposed that course work at PhD IR should be reduced to 18 credit hours as per HEC requirement. With the existing number of credit hours i.e. 27 (3 semesters) the student gets only one chance to appear for comprehensive exam held by University. By reducing number of credit hours for course work to 18 (2 semesters) the student will get at least 2 chances to appear for the comprehensive examination during a year.
