**NOTE:**

The "BASAR" in its 40<sup>th</sup> meeting held on August 18-19, 2022 and the "Academic Council" in its 32<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on Sept 8, 2022 respectively have approved the **revised Road Map** of M.Phil Islamic Thought and Civilization Degree Program according to which the existing 8 compulsory courses will remain with compulsory status whereas the M.Phil ITC Thesis (6 Credit hours) will be considered as elective instead of compulsory and the student may take two courses in lieu of M.Phil ITC Thesis out of the four elective courses newly added with the approval of BASAR in the existing scheme of studies of M.Phil ITC Degree Program. Furthermore, this revised Road Map is effective from the M.Phil ITC Batch admitted in Fall 2021 to onward.
