Intro to Gender Studies for Competitive Exams

Introduction

Federal Public Service Commission of Pakistan has included Gender Studies as an optional subject in its competitive exams especially in CSS. The course has been opted by a significant number of candidates appeared in previous CSS exams and is considered a scoring option for CSS candidates. - To use gender lens to critically examine development paradigms and gendered impact of development policies and processes to advocate gender equity and justice in the society.

- The participants will have an opportunity to interact with wide variety of students and teachers having different point of views broadening their own frame of references.

Duration

- Total duration of the course will be 8 weeks or two Months
- The entire course will be divided into 8 modules and the students will be promoted in the next module once they will pass the previous one.
- Classes will be held twice a week, and the duration of each class will be 3 hours.

Participants Criteria

- The currently enrolled students of undergraduate program completed at least 6 semesters from UMT or any other university willing to pursue competitive exams in future will be registered.
- Candidates of CSS or any other competitive exam preparing individually or from any academy will also be offered this course for the registration.
