Muhammad Anwar, Chief Library Officer, University of Management and Technology, participated in an International Summer School on Digital Libraries a'la Carte 2010 held at Tilburg University, the Netherlands from July 26-30, 2010. The program was organised by TICER (Tilburg Innovation Centre for Electronic Resources), a business unit of Tilburg University Library and IT Services.

The course comprised of five centralized modules: strategic developments and library management, the library in the scholar's workflow and research data, libraries - partners in teaching and learning, mobile technologies in education and library, and Web 2.0 and linked data in libraries.

The course objectives focused on intellectual capability building in the areas of library management system, and its planning in the long term. The program was tailor-made aiming at senior library managers and directors, deputy librarians, library middle managers, digital library project managers, IT or systems librarians, IT specialists, information specialists, research support, teaching and learning support, and researchers who were responsible for strategic systems and related developments in the form of technical and administrative order.

UMT students achieve second position in the countrywide OCMTP Telenor Competition

Students from the School of Business and Economics (SBE) have secured second position in the country-wide On-Campus Management Trainee Program (OCMTP) launched by Telenor Pakistan under the umbrella of "Shaping the Professionals of Tomorrow". **Haseeb Javed, Ali Hussain Chohan, Waqas Ul Hassan, Sulman Manawar** and **Faheem Dilawar** have made us proud by competing against 950 students from top universities in the country.

UMT shares grief, offers relief to flood victims

Office of the Rector

The team from the Office of the Rector joined hands with other organizations to provide relief to the flood victims. The FLP Lahore team became actively involved in flood relief efforts in southern Punjab soon after the disaster hit the country. In the second phase of the relief effort, the team drove all the way to Nowshehra, Khyber Pukhtoonkhwa which is one of the worst flood hit areas of the country. The FLP Lahore, in collaboration with the UMT, Tricastmedia Pvt Ltd, students of Beaconhouse School Defence Branch, Lahore, Apprentice Scholar of Beaconhouse National University, staff of The Resource Group (TRG) and alumni of Lawrence College raised PKR 1 million for Nowshehra. The focus of the relief effort shifted from food items to non-food items like kitchen sets, stove and gas cylinder, soap, towel, bucket, plastic mats and mattresses. Two trucks were filled with house/kitchen accessories for 200 families, ration packets for 150 families, and tents for 86 families. Aid in cash was arranged for restoration of small enterprises on the advice of President FLP. Eighteen members of FLP Lahore team left for Nowshehra and arrived in Risalpur accompanied by local partners. The camp was installed in Government High School, Mohib Banda, some 30 kilometers from Nowshehra Cantonment. A roster of duty was issued and finally Team 1 was in action developing sets for each family. Team 2 started the process of registration and Team 3 was set up for inspection. Through analysis of registration, it was estimated that some 466 families benefited from this activity. The committee is responsible for better and timely distribution of relief goods in the form of clothes, shelter, beds, utensils, etc. to the flood victims.

The team of participants who were students of BS Social Sciences launched a massive campaign to collect funds and food items from UMT community and its surroundings. Dr Abdul Hameed was in-charge of the entire activity and its management. Ambreen Salahuddin supervised fund raising activities and Ilyas Ansari led the team to Rohianwali, Tehsil Muzaffargarh on August 28, 2010. The team surveyed the affected families, identified their needs and distributed the food and clothing in a graceful manner according to their needs. The team is now ready to send second convoy to other areas. The unique feature of this relief effort was pre-assessment of the most deserving areas, survey of the families to assess their needs and distribution of necessities of life at the door step in person. This has increased the motivation level of the team. Many other faculty and staff members joined hands.

The team prepared ration packs for 400 families. Each ration pack included commodities like rice, sugar, red chili, oil, daal channa, salt, tea, soap, milk, match boxes, achar, biscuits and juices. Moreover, 116 packs containing women's clothes including girls' clothes and 65 packs of men's clothes including clothes for boys were also distributed. Many items of common daily use were also included in the relief goods. These items included flour packs, channa packs, Rooh Afza bottles, blankets, pillows, cushions, towels, bed sheets, bottles of mineral water and milk.

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
