1) Common Fund for Commodities seeking Proposals to Support Commodity Development Activities (15th Round)

(Deadline: 15 October 2019)

The Common Fund for Commodities (CFC) is inviting applicants for support of commodity development activities in its member countries. The CFC provides a range of financial and technical instruments in support or business activities contributing to commodity sector development in Developing Countries. Examples include agriculture, commodity value addition and trade, minerals and metals. Besides generating a viable financial return, eligible activities should also deliver a measurable social and environmental impact.

- **Social:** Create employment (particularly for youth and women), provide a sustained increase in household incomes, reduce poverty, and enhance food security.
- **Economic:** Enhance production and productivity, achieve higher local value addition; improve the competitiveness of producers, producer organisations and small and medium-sized industries, support the financial sector development.
- **Environmental:** Enhance production taking into account the environment and its long term possibilities for the same, or increased use of productive resources while maintaining or reducing the impact on the environment.
 - Are innovative, scalable and replicable.
 - Are financially sustainable.
 - Have a potential measurable positive socio-economic and environmental impact on the stakeholders in commodity value chains as compared to the prevailing baseline situation.
 - Develop stronger connections with existing markets or create new markets along the value chain.
 - Increase financial or other services available for commodity producers and commodity-based businesses.
 - Enhance knowledge generation and information dissemination.
 - Build effective and cost-efficient collaboration between producers, industry, governments, civil society organisations and other stakeholders for commoditybased development.
 - Enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of agricultural value chains Inter alia including climate change and energy-related sensitive components as appropriate.

2) R2HC Annual Funding Call to address Specific or Multiple Public Health Issues

(**Deadline: 16 July 2019**)

The Enhancing Learning and Research for Humanitarian Assistance (ELRHA) are pleased to announce its Research for Health in Humanitarian Crises (R2HC) Annual Funding Call that addresses specific or multiple public health issues by gathering evidence with the potential to contribute to improved public health outcomes in humanitarian contexts. Priority areas:

- public health priorities specific to the context of a humanitarian crisis that lacks a solid existing evidence base;
- how public health interventions not specific to a humanitarian context can be adapted and delivered, and their effectiveness maximised, in a humanitarian context;
- health systems, including coordination of the public health response in humanitarian contexts and health system strengthening in conflict-affected countries;
- Specific interventions designed to improve health outcomes, such as cash transfers.
- Proposals may focus on specific, or multiple public health issues, gathering data or evidence with the potential to contribute to improved public health outcomes in humanitarian contexts.
- Proposals must include a partnership between at least one academic or research institution and one operational humanitarian partner. Either body can be the lead organisation for the application. Under Call 7, they have an additional requirement, that the research consortium must include at least one academic or a research institution from the country(s) or region(s) in which applicants plan to undertake research.
- Research proposals are required to demonstrate how gender equality and social inclusion will be addressed through the research process and, also, how the research outcomes will contribute to increased gender equality and social inclusion during humanitarian crises.
- Proposals that focus on addressing public health issues specifically affecting vulnerable and marginalised populations, such as people with disabilities, the elderly, women and girls, and hard-to-reach groups, will be welcomed. Proposals should consider how vulnerable and marginalised groups access health services and are integrated into the planning of service provision.
- The potential scale of impact of funded research is an important criteria and they therefore strongly encourage applications that focus on:
- comparative (multi-country) research
- research that is replicable in multiple contexts
- multi-sector integrated responses
- Inclusion of cost-effectiveness analyses (where appropriate).
- Proposed research methodologies should be of a standard such that final papers will be publishable in peer-reviewed academic journals. Robust innovative



methodologies that advance research in humanitarian settings are encouraged. Primary and/or secondary data collection approaches will be considered.

• Research proposals may focus on any of the various humanitarian crisis settings, whether urban or rural, camp or the general population.

The Islamic Cultural Trails is the third Research Grant on South Asian Cultural Trails and was approved by the 10th Governing Board Meeting of the SAARC Cultural Centre and the 56th Session of the Programming Committee of SAARC.
