Essay Writing Competition

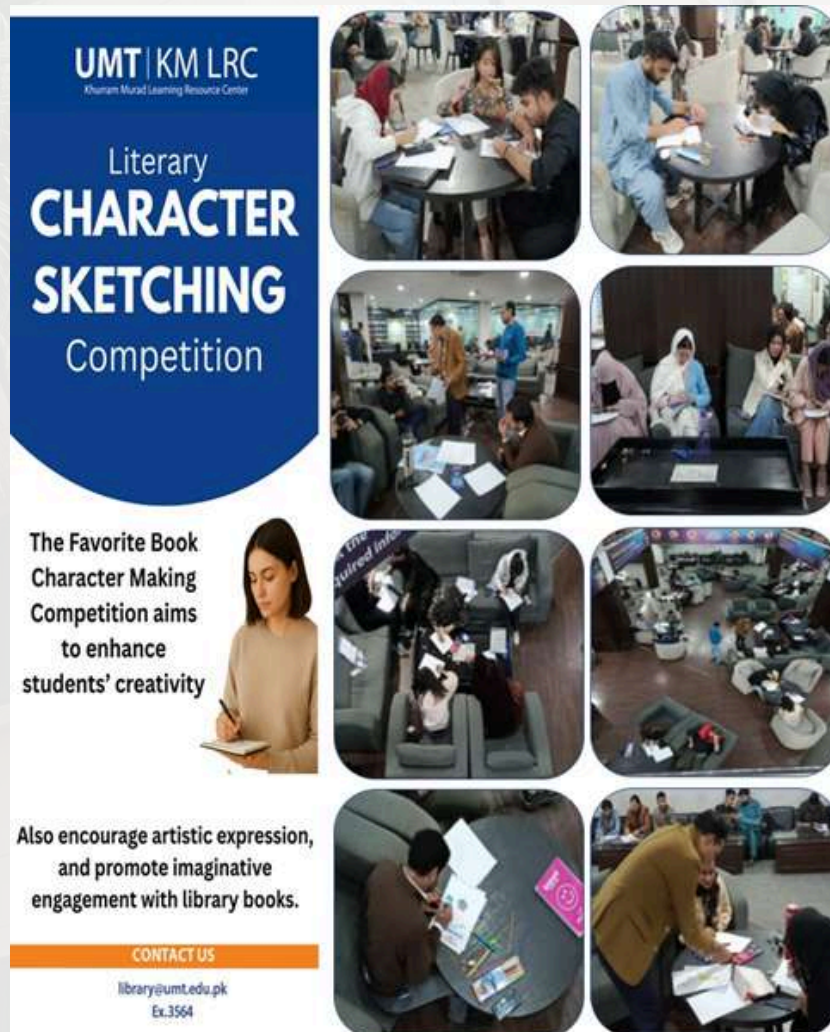
