March 15-16, 2017, Hotel Pearl Continental, Lahore

The summary apprehends a two-day program of presenting academic research and practitioner projects, panel discussions and enriched interactive dialogues at the 2nd International Conference on "Catalyzing SME growth through Research", which took place on March 15-16, 2017. After the great success of 1st National SME conference, UMT School of Business and Economics with joint efforts of Ministry of Industries & Production and Small and Medium Enterprise Development Authority (SMEDA) organized this magnificent opportunity at an international level where a large number of SME professionals, research experts, business representatives, faculty members and students participated with national and international background. The 2nd International SME conference began with inaugural remarks by Sheikh Allauddin, Minister for Industries, Commerce & Investment, Government of Punjab; Dr. Hasan Sohaib Murad; Rector UMT, Mr. Sher Ayub Khan; Chief Executive Officer, SMEDA; H.E. Four different thematic areas on SMEs concerns were managed separately by respective session panel, each consisting of one academic expert, market expert and SME representative. Session I-Theme 'Developing a Conducive Business Environment for SMEs' was led by Dr. Jawad Syed (Dean, LUMS) for gaining richness of skills and expertise on the theme. Session II- Theme 'Local & International Market Development for SMEs' was chaired by Dr. Mehtab S. Karim in the board that proved as a strategic think tank. Session III-



Theme 'Entrepreneurship & Enterprise Development' was moderated by collaborative panel of Dr. Ijaz Qureshi (Dean, UOL) and Mr. Saqib Chohan (Representative of VC, CUSIT) that acted as ideal platform for raising issues on the theme. Session IV- Theme 'SMEs Access to Finance' was held on second day of conference and provided an opportunity for practice and constructive dialogue on Pakistani SMEs in which Dr. Jan Mohammad (Director UOB, Quetta) chaired the session.

In every session, a number of Private and Public projects of each theme were presented to receive thoughtful reflection. The enriched and valuable discussions, debates and feedback over the presented material suggested 'Good Practices and experiences' are not transportable and replicated from one context of SME sector to another but should be taken as 'inspiring experiences'. The venue of two-days program was fully packed and also provided a great opportunity for social networking and professional interaction among participants.
