

The German language program at UMT is open to students, faculty, staff, alumni, as well as outsiders. Classes will be held in the evenings, and enrolled students will have access to a specialized online learning platform developed by DUO to track their progress, and have some fun while learning.

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## Blended Learning German Language Program Center for Languages, ILA

The Center for Languages at the Institute of Liberal Arts, in collaboration with DCG-Halle and Deutsch-Uni Online (DUO), is starting German language classes at the UMT campus.

These classes will include a specialized online learning platform by DUO in which students will be enrolled for self-study.

Starting with the first module (A1.1), the program will include further modules (A1.2, A2.1, A2.2, B1.1, B1.2, B2.1, B2.2, and C1.1) for comprehensive language study routes.

Students have four routes of study to choose from – three of these routes follow a normal track of 10 hours of classroom sessions per week for eleven weeks for every module, while one route is fast-tracked with 16 hours of classroom sessions per week for seven weeks.

At the successful completion of each module, students will receive certificates from DUO.

Further details about the modules being offered at a particular time are listed on the application form.

### Details of the program are given below:

Details	Students can opt for every module separately.	Students will study two years (six modules from A1.1 to B1.2) at UMT, and then continue their language learning at Anhalt University in Germany. Students will study for two years at UMT, covering seven modules (A1.1 to C1.1). They will then take the TestDaF exam on their own.
