Cluster-Based Training Session





The TKS Head Office training team conducted an online cluster-based teachers' training session for preschool and senior school on the 4th and 6th of May 2021. A total of 9 campuses participated in this session, including PWD Campus, Junior Gulbahar Campus, Senior Gulbahar Campus, Charsada Campus, Sohawa Campus, Chamkni Campus, Syed Asghar Ali Shah Campus, Millennium Campus and Peshawar Campus. The main target of these interactive sessions is to train teachers and improve their abilities. The session for prechool involved creating a home environment that encourages child learning, while the session for senior school teachers revolved around active learning strategies. Head Senior School Jennifer Javed Khan and Head Preschool Ishrat Tabbasum conducted the training sessions. All participants were glad to learn new techniques to teach old subjects in a new fashion. They appreciated the Head Office training team, with feedback from the principals and coordinators being positive. They assured the team of the application of the newly-learnt techniques.

CPDP Online Training Session



The Head Office training team conducted an online training session on the 6th of March, 2021, for the academic Session 2021 – 2022. The training was with regards to the Continuous Professional Development Program (CPDP), which the TKS Head Office training team conducts regularly to ensure the professional development of the faculty at its campuses. 26 participants from a total of 10 campuses participated in this training session. The campuses that attended were Habe'el Campus, Al Wahid Campus, City Campus, Fatima Campus, Expo Centre Campus, Al-Shareef Campus, Allama Iqbal Campus, Ch. Fazal Campus, Samanabad Campus and Iqbal Campus.

Head Senior School Jennifer Javed Khan explained the process of thinking (metacognition), which is a skill that promotes advanced learning. Head Preschool Ishrat Tabbasum described the ideal learning environment for early learners in detail. All the principals and coordinators who participated in the session appreciated the efforts of the Head Office training team.

On-Demand Training Session

TKS Head Office training team conducted an on-demand training session on Saturday, 13th February 2021 at Habeel Campus in Lahore for the academic session 2021 – 2022. A total of 8 participants attended this training session. In order to ensure teacher capability, TKS academic trainers plan and conduct trainings amongst various campuses all year round. The main objective of these training sessions is to provide an opportunity for TKS teachers country-wide to learn how to improve their teaching skills. Head Senior School Jennifer Javed Khan and Head Preschool Ishrat Tabbasum conducted the training sessions, which were about phonics, arts and crafts and classroom management. All teachers who took part in this training were enthusiastic about learning new techniques that could be applied to existing subjects, which would allow them to impart knowledge in a stimulating fashion. 




Mother's Day

Mother's Day is a celebration honoring the matriarchs of families, as well as motherhood, maternal bonds and the influence of mothers in society in general. It is celebrated at various times in various places all over the world, but the dates usually fall in the months of May and March. In Pakistan this year, the day will be celebrated on Sunday, May 9. The day involves paying tribute to mothers all over the world for the sacrifices they make, which are motivated by the love they bear for their children. In many countries, particularly Eastern countries, mothers are always held in high regard and esteem, and this day is a culmination of the respect and love one should display towards their materfamilias. In TKS, students are instructed to conduct activities on this day that encourage them to take note of the daily labour of their mothers and to fashion keepsakes demonstrating affection, love and respect towards them.







Eid-ul-Fitr is a religious occasion observed by Muslims worldwide that marks an end to the month of fasting, or Ramadan. The month itself is very spiritual and has been decreed upon Muslims to make them understand the terrible privations and harsh realities that the poor have to face on a day-to-day basis. Thus, the month devotes itself to engendering a spirit of brotherhood and unity amongst Muslims all over the world, regardless of social status, creed and race. This then culminates in Eid, an occasion that is both a celebration and also a chance to spread joy amongst the needy by giving Zakat, or charity, although this is an activity that reoccurs during the fasting month itself. During this time, while at home, TKS students are instructed in activities they can conduct to help the poor and the needy and to demonstrate the true religious feeling and fervour that the day arouses. This year, the Eid holidays extend from Monday, May 10, 2021 to Saturday, May 15, 2021, for all institutions and organisations in Pakistan.



TKS NWA Convention 2021

The TKS Head Office (HO) held their Network Association (NWA) Convention 2021 on Saturday, 10th April. Conducted in the morning at 10.30 am, the event was hosted online by the TKS HO on Zoom and was attended by over 150 participants. The event began with a recitation from the Holy Quran, after which an audio clip of the national anthem was played. The session then began in earnest, with speeches from Manager Accounts Imran Elahi, involving a recap of the year 2020 with regards to the services provided by the TKS HO during the pandemic, and Director TKS, describing what the future entailed for educational institutions in general and TKS campuses in particular. This was followed up with a question and answer session, which ended with a prize distribution ceremony. Feedback from the event showed that the participants were pleased with the convention and would definitely consider attending it again when held in the future.







Manager Accounts Imran Elahi Presentation



The first speech held during the NWA Convention was by TKS Manager Accounts Imran Elahi, who described the situation in the country created by the pandemic from the time of the first lockdown to date. He punctuated the description with highlights of services rendered by the TKS Head Office during this time period. He stated that, in addition to the regular services provided by the TKS Head Office, many steps were taken to support and guide TKS campuses during this tumultuous time. He called to attention homework material provided to campuses during the first lockdown to keep students engaged. He went on to underscore the development of work instructions, audio stories, the extremely early distribution of the summer pack and the development of over 300 video tutorials to be shared with students as services furnished outside of the

ambit of regular operational and academic support that TKS campuses are entitled to. He mentioned that specific teacher training sessions were held to prepare faculty for remote teaching and that webinars were conducted to keep campuses informed of ways to manage their income and expenses during those straitened times. He noted that the School Management System was refined and improved in order to make it more accessible for staff, parents and students. When the government launched their Accelerated Learning Program to make up for shortcomings in course content covered, he said that the TKS Head Office was not caught unawares, with a Smart Syllabus for the session 2020-2021 already under development according to those lines, which was later distributed on October 12, 2020. To ensure adherence to SOPs when schools reopened, he drew attention to the standardised flyers on COVID-19 prevention quidelines developed by the TKS Head Office for the use of individual campuses. At the close of the academic year, he described how the TKS Head Office shared the plan for the entire next academic year of 2021 – 2022 with TKS campuses. He noted that, in spite of strict lockdowns, the TKS Head Office quality assurance team still visited campuses to evaluate and assess their areas of concern, covering up to 30 campuses in the previous year. With regards to marketing, he underlined the marketing campaign conducted by the TKS Head Office on social media, outdoor advertising and electronic media, noting that several unique measures were taken to circumvent the climate created by the pandemic, including local level marketing done in campus districts and an added functionality to the TKS website that enabled parents to begin the admission process online without having to visit the campus they were applying to. He concluded by saying that he hoped his speech had been both encouraging and illuminating.

In her speech, she touched on the importance of education in general, while noting the difficulities brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic that made its provision difficult. Reassuring the NWAs present about the TKS HO's commitment to them, she declared that they would ensure constant development of campus faculty to guarantee the delivery of a superior form of education. She assuaged uncertainties about the single national curriculum, stating that TKS was abreast of the situation. She ended her speech by reiterating the vision and

mission of TKS, declaring that they would continue to ignite young minds to help them realise their true potential and that TKS was, and would remain, a platform to connect future leaders of Pakistan.



Prize Distribution Ceremony

The NWA Convention 2021 ended with a prize distribution ceremony during which high-achieving TKS students and the longest-running TKS campuses were awarded certificates. The TKS students were also awarded cash pirzes for their achievements. The recipients were gratified and pledged to uphold the vision and mission of TKS during the years to come.


